The Emory Pre-College Program brings bright, ambitious, rising high school Juniors and Seniors to Emory in the summer to give them a short college-level experience. Over the past decade, the Emory Pre-College Program has experienced high demand and strong growth. Teaching in the program provides instructors with a unique opportunity to expose high-school students to college-level material and the university classroom environment, a rewarding experience for both faculty and students.

Current Emory faculty, emeritus faculty members, and advanced graduate students with strong teaching records are eligible to propose courses for the Pre-College Program. Below are the dates for the two-week non-credit course sessions. Each of these two-week courses will include a minimum of 25 contact hours. The in-person courses meet daily from 9:00-11:30 am.

- Session A (in-person) June 19-30
- Session B (in-person) July 3 14
- Session C (in-person) July 17 -28
- Session C (online) July 17- 28 (class meeting times, tbd)
